As such, it provides the basis for examining groups of people as well as whole neighborhoods. The communal aspects of urban living are discussed in Chapters 1 and 2, attachment toward the neighborhood in Chapter 3, importance of religion, life cycle, and race in Chapter 4, various aspects of individual social support systems and neighborhood social fabric in Chapters 5, 6, and 7, the contextual aspects of the neighborhood environment in Chapters 8 and 9, and the implications for urban policy in Chapter 10. The results of the analysis described in the book provide a detailed understanding of differences in the structure and composition of urban neighborhoods and they show why some groups of people are drawn into their neighborhoods whereas others rely more upon the wider community to meet a variety of needs. The analysis provides the framework in which to address the implications for urban policy, particularly with respect to mental health, prevention, and neighborhood and community renewal.
