Effective Classroom Behaviour Management Strategies

Classroom behaviour management strategies can improve student behaviour and enable teaching and learning to proceed as planned.

Strategy 1: Follow a routine.

A routine ensures that students know what is coming next, so you will spend less time giving out instructions - freeing up time to do the actual work.



Strategy 2: Involve the students in rule-setting.

If the teachers set the rules, the class may not always agree. That's why having an audience with your students is essential when you develop the rules. When children take ownership of the rules, they are likely to follow them and improve behaviour management.



Strategy 3: Make your lessons enjoyable.

Boring, unengaging lessons can lead to disruptive behaviour from students. Structure your activities so that students are engaged and involved. Aim to have them uncover knowledge with practical exercises. Vary your teaching methods and make the work interactive and fun.



Strategy 4: Use positive language when you set your class rules.

Using positive language makes students feel respected, encouraging better behaviour. Additionally, positive body language will set an excellent example for the kids and help them learn from your demeanor.



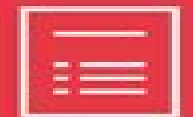
Strategy 5: Develop a meaningful relationship with your students.

Getting to know your students individually is crucial to engage them better in the classroom. Find out their interests and dislikes and any potential triggers for bad behaviour.



Strategy 6: Be considerate when giving grades.

Students who get poor marks are typically disruptive in class and deliberately fall short of behaviour expectations to deflect from the real issue. Use an innovative marking rubric. Instead of grading a paper with As or Bs, check the items where they got it right and identify misunderstood concepts. This non-traditional grading method reduces the overwhelming feeling of poor grades.
