What is a film?

What goes into a film?

- **Frames:** still pictures
- **Apparent motion:** quick succession of frames to create movement
- **Negative:** emerging film strip (opposite lights/colors of what was filmed)
- **Positive:** finished images (what was actually filmed and can be presented)

What are the advantages of digital filmmaking? – Using a digital camera, using software to edit.

- Cheaper than film strips
- Mistakes can be undone
- More freedom for creativity

Filmmaking

- **Pre-production** (Already have a script and secured funding (executive producer arranges financial rights), scout location, schedule shooting (when/where), storyboard (shot preparation))
