

8 TIPS FOR SIGHT READING



1. THE KEY

Identify the major or minor scale and sharps/flats.



2. TIME SIGNATURE

Determine beats per measure and note value for the beat.



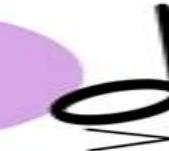
3. TEMPO MARKING

Recognize the speed of the piece (e.g., Allegro, Adagio).



4. DYNAMICS

Note loudness and softness (e.g., piano, forte) and any changes.



5. ARTICULATION

Understand how to play notes (e.g., staccato, legato).



6. PHRASING & STRUCTURE

Analyze sections of the piece (e.g., verses, choruses).



7. HAND COORDINATION

Identify the roles of each hand for smooth playing.



8. CHORD PROGRESSIONS

Recognize common chord structures and modulations.
