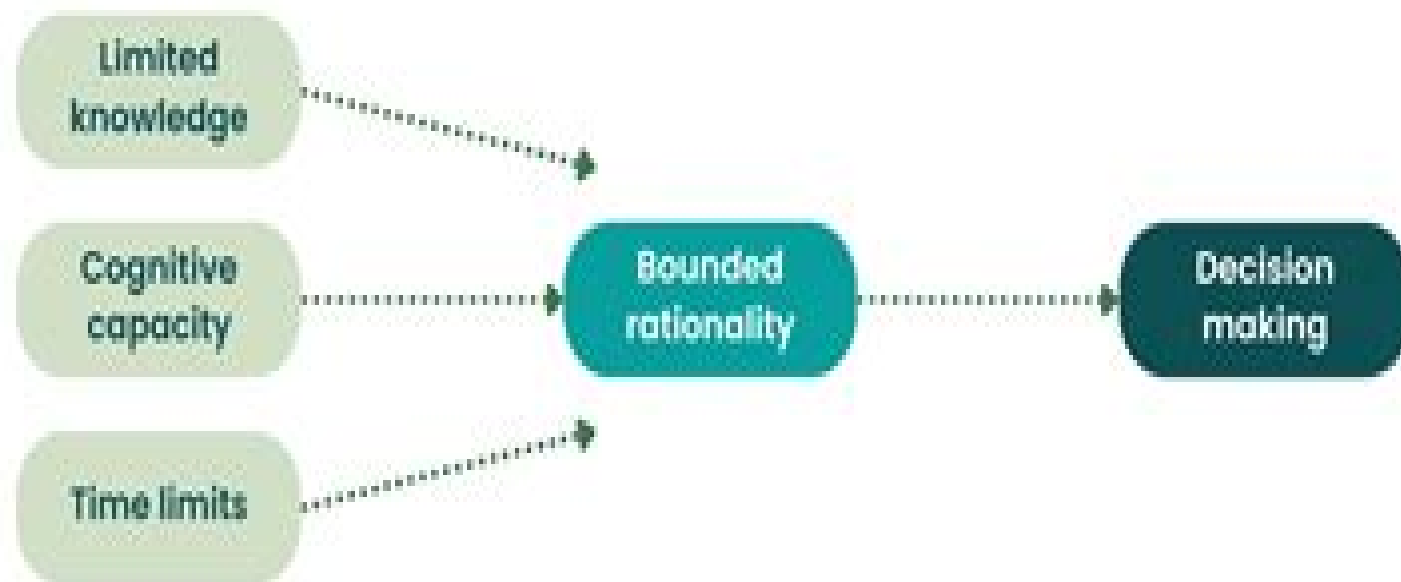

*Modeling Bounded Rationality* Ariel Rubinstein, 1998 The notion of bounded rationality was initiated in the 1950s by Herbert Simon only recently has it influenced mainstream economics In this book Ariel Rubinstein defines models of bounded rationality as those in which elements of the process of choice are explicitly embedded The book focuses on the challenges of modeling bounded rationality rather than on substantial economic implications In the first part of the book the author considers the modeling of choice After discussing some psychological findings he proceeds to the modeling of procedural rationality knowledge memory the choice of what to know and group decisions In the second part he discusses the fundamental difficulties of modeling bounded rationality in games He begins with the modeling of a game with procedural rational players and then surveys repeated games with complexity considerations He ends with a discussion of computability constraints in games The final chapter includes a critique by Herbert Simon of the author's methodology and the author's response The Zeuthen Lecture Book series is sponsored by the Institute of Economics at the University of Copenhagen

**Models of Bounded Rationality and Mechanism Design** Jacob Glazer, Ariel Rubinstein, 2016-08-22 This book brings together the authors joint papers from over a period of more than twenty years The collection includes seven papers each of which presents a novel and rigorous model in Economic Theory All of the models are within the domain of implementation and mechanism design theories These theories attempt to explain how incentive schemes and organizations can be designed with the goal of inducing agents to behave according to the designer's principal's objectives Most of the literature assumes that agents are fully rational In contrast the authors inject into each model an element which conflicts with the standard notion of full rationality demonstrating how such elements can dramatically change the mechanism design problem Although all of the models presented in this volume touch on mechanism design issues it is the formal modeling of bounded rationality that the authors are most interested in A model of bounded rationality signifies a model that contains a procedural element of reasoning that is not consistent with full rationality Rather than looking for a canonical model of bounded rationality the articles introduce a variety of modeling devices that will capture procedural elements not previously considered and which alter the analysis of the model The book is a journey into the modeling of bounded rationality It is a collection of modeling ideas rather than a general alternative theory of implementation

*Price Dynamics in Equilibrium Models* Jan Tuinstra, 2012-12-06 A long standing unsolved problem in economic theory is how economic equilibria are attained *Price Dynamics in Equilibrium Models* The Search for Equilibrium and the Emergence of Endogenous Fluctuations considers a number of adjustment processes in different economic models and investigates their dynamical behaviour Two important themes arising in this context are bounded rationality and nonlinear dynamics Important sub themes of the book are the following how do boundedly rational agents interact with their environment and does this interaction in some sense lead to rational outcomes which may or may not correspond to equilibria The second sub theme deals with the consequences of the nonlinear dynamical nature of many adjustment processes The results presented in this volume indicate that endogenous fluctuations are the rule rather than the exception in the search for equilibrium The book uses the theory of nonlinear dynamics to analyze the dynamics of the different economic models Due to the complexity of most of the models an important role is played by computational methods In particular at regular instances the models are analyzed by numerical simulations and some computer assisted proofs are provided It also covers a wide range of dynamical models from economic theory Most of these models merge the theory of nonlinear economic dynamics with the theory of bounded rationality The book is written for anyone with an interest in economic theory in general and bounded rationality and endogenous fluctuations in particular It is entirely self contained and accessible to readers with only a limited knowledge of economic theory

**A Framework for Modeling Bounded Rationality** Ignacio Esponda, 2016 We provide a framework to study dynamic optimization problems where the agent is uncertain about her environment but has possibly an incorrectly specified model in the sense that the support of her prior does not include the true model The agent's actions affect both her payoff and also what she observes about the environment she then uses these observations to update her prior according to Bayes rule We show that if optimal behavior stabilizes in this environment then it is characterized by what we call an equilibrium An equilibrium strategy is a mapping from payoff relevant states to actions such that i given the strategy the agent's model that is closest according to the Kullback Leibler divergence to the true model and ii the strategy is a solution to the dynamic optimization problem where the agent is certain that the correct model is the one in i The framework is applicable to several aspects of bounded rationality where the reason why a decision maker has incorrect beliefs can be traced to her use of an incorrectly specified model
