Managing Challenging Behaviour

Tantrums / Excessive Anger

Shouting, Screaming, Crying, Throwing themselves

Breaking Things / Disrespect

Throwing / kicking objects, breaking toys, cursing

Hurting Others

Biting, Hitting, Kicking, Name-calling

Defiance

Refusing to follow requests, rules or instructions

Fussing

Refusing to eat certain foods or take part in certain activities

Possible Reasons for Behaviour

Modelled - Child copying learned behaviours from adults or stimulation

Seeking - Child is looking for attention or something difficult

Attention - Child feels overwhelmed by too much going on

Child may be expressing strong emotions or boundaries

Unwell / Tired or Hungry

Change in Routine / Family Circumstances



Prevention & Intervention Strategies

Understand - Notice and understand what situations trigger the behaviour and adapt, avoid or help child find better coping strategies.

Ignore - Good for minor attention-seeking behaviours.

Ignore the behaviour and only reward the child with attention once they have stopped the behaviour.

Distract - Stop the negative behaviour or prevent a situation from escalating by providing an appealing alternative.

Encourage Empathy - Point out how the negative behaviour makes another person feel (e.g. sad, hurt). Ask child to imagine how they would feel if someone did the same to them.

Be Clear & Consistent - Ensure child is clear about what you want them to do. Be consistent in how negative behaviour is dealt with.

Promoting Positive Behaviour

Praise the Positive - Give praise and attention to positive behaviour. e.g. thank child for being helpful, give a high-five when they are kind to others.

Being a Good Role Model - Demonstrate positive behaviours, favourable attitudes and desirable ways to interact with others. Children learn by copying behaviours!

Support Emotional Wellbeing - Through routines and activities, help children learn about feelings and emotions, why we have them and how we can share and manage them.

Allow Choices & Rewards - Allow child choose next toy, use 'they have been kind and helpful' OR give certificates or certificates to help visually reinforce behaviour.
