Isenstein,1978 Dr William E Bunney Jr of the National Institute of Mental Health s Intramural Research Program has been investigating the biological causes of depression He focused on a phenomenon called the switch mechanism Noting that there is often a sudden drastic mercurial change from depressive episodes to manic phases he studied these patients and theorized that elevated or reduced levels of the neurotransmitters norepinephrine and dopamine may be responsible for the sudden shift from the depressed immobile state to the active psychotic manic state and vice versa The research described in this monograph has great significance for the control of disturbed behavior through medication and for understanding the trigger mechanism in the brain affected by environmental

stresses It is another step toward gathering the knowledge needed to alleviate the suffering of depressed persons
