Theatre, Exhibition, and Curation Georgina Guy, 2016-04-20 Examining the artistic intellectual and social life of performance this book interrogates Theatre and Performance Studies through the lens of display and modern visual art Moving beyond the exhibition of immaterial art and its documents as well as re enactment in gallery contexts Guy's book articulates an emerging field of arts practice distinct from but related to increasing curatorial provision for live performance Drawing on a recent proliferation of object centric events of display that interconnect with theatre the book approaches artworks in terms of their curation together and re theorizes the exhibition as a dynamic context in which established traditions of display and performance interact By examining the current traffic of ideas and aesthetics moving between theatricality and curatorial practice the study reveals how the reception of a specific form is often mediated via the ontological expectations of another It asks how contemporary visual arts and exhibition practices display performance and what it means to generalize the theatrical as the optic or directive of a curatorial concept Proposing a symbiotic relation between theatricality and display Guy presents cases from international arts institutions which are both displayed and performed including the Tate Modern and the Guggenheim and assesses their significance to the enduring relation between theatre and the visual arts The book progresses from the conventional alignment of theatricality and ephemerality within performance research and teases out a new temporality for performance with which contemporary exhibitions implicitly

experiment thereby identifying supplementary modes of performance which other discourses exclude This important study joins the fields of Theatre and Performance Studies with exciting new directions in curation aesthetics sociology of the arts visual arts the creative industries the digital humanities cultural heritage and reception and audience theories

Ungoverning Dance Ramsay Burt, 2016-10-11 *Ungoverning Dance* examines the work of progressive contemporary dance artists in continental Europe from the mid 1990s to 2015 Placing this within the context of neoliberalism and austerity the book argues that these artists have developed an ethico aesthetic approach that uses dance practices as sites of resistance against dominant ideologies and that their works attest to the persistence of alternative ways of thinking and living In response to the way that the radical values informing their work are continually under attack from neoliberalism these artists recognise that they in effect share common pool resources Thus while contemporary dance has been turned into a market they nevertheless value the extent to which it functions as a commons Work that does this it argues ungoverns dance The book offers close readings of works from the 1990s and 2000s by two generations of European based dance artists that of J r me Bel Jonathan Burrows La Ribot and Xavier Le Roy who began showing work in the 1990s and that of artists who emerged in the 2000s including Fabi n Barba Faustin Linyekula Ivana M ller and Nikolina Pristas Topics examined include dance and precarious life choreographing friendship re performance the virtual in dance and a dancer s experience of the Egyptian revolution *Ungoverning Dance* proposes new ways of understanding recent contemporary European dance works by making connections with their social political and theoretical contexts

The Pantagruel Syndrome Francesco Bonami, Carolyn Christov-Bakargiev, 2005 A catalogue of the first edition of the triennial exhibition of contemporary art in Turin organised in collaboration with the Castello di Rivoli Museum of Contemporary Art Gallery of Modern and Contemporary Art and the Sandretto Re Rebaudengo Foundation In two parts the first involved 75 young artists from all over the world who presented new experimental works the second paid homage to two young but already established artists Doris Salcedo and Takashi Murakami

Blueprints for No-man's Land Janet Stewart, Simon Ward, 2005 This volume brings together a collection of essays focusing on selected aspects of inter and multidisciplinary in contemporary Austrian culture These include the connections between literature and the media literature and the visual arts literature and travel and the visual arts and public space The individual contributions deal with central figures in the Austrian arts including Thomas Bernhard Franzobel Elfriede Jelinek Peter Handke Peter Turrini and Doron Rabinovici as well as collective ventures such as Walter Grond s Odysseus project and the museum in progress They analyse the impact of connections between disciplines on the cultural landscape in contemporary Austria as well as examining the limits of such interaction between disciplines

Kenneth Goldsmith's Recent Works on Paper Daniel Morris, 2019-12-09 Kenneth Goldsmith's *Recent Works on Paper* is the first critical book devoted to Kenneth Goldsmith the acclaimed conceptual poet pedagogue and provocateur The book's focus is on *Capital Wasting Time on the Internet* *Against Translation* and *Theory* all published within a year of Goldsmith's controversial reading of a poem based on the Michael Brown autopsy report at Brown University in March 2015 These four books address issues of historiography translation pedagogy authorship and celebrity culture Each book serves a retrospective function for an author who is mid career taking stock of his considerable impact on U S and world poetics at the very moment when critics are challenging the ethics of his aesthetic judgment in the wake of the controversy surrounding *The Body of Michael Brown* The author focuses on how Goldsmith stages and in some cases transforms his metamorphic identity as a post humanist information manager His performance in these four books complicates the current image of him among many critics and fellow poets as one of Hillary Clinton's basket of deplorables who displayed extremely poor judgment while contributing to a culture of racial insensitivity by performing *The Body of Michael Brown* **Disorder in the House** Lieven Van Den Abeele, 2010 The Vanhaerents Art Collection contains hundreds of top art pieces and installations by modern artists It was founded by Walter Vanhaerents and has recently been moved to a restored dock house in the centre of Brussels This book is the catalogue that goes with the first exhibition of this collection A bold mix of installations video art and paintings from international artists such as Bruce Nauman Paul McCarthy Mariko Mori Takashi Murakami Tom Sachs Francesco Vezzoli Matthew Barney ILLUSTRATIONS 120 colour illustrations **The World as a Stage** Jessica Morgan, 2007 *The World as a Stage* presents a key group of international contemporary artists Pavel Althamer Catherine Sullivan Tino Sehgal and others who reinvigorate the rich historical relationship between visual art and theater Challenging negative associations made between the notion of theatricality and the realm of visual art in recent decades the artists in this book make visible the extent to which a sense of theater or spectacle now permeates the spectator's role in the museum or gallery and how this carries through to their experience of the contemporary urban environment Considering a variety of media including installation sculpture performance participatory works and events this book deals with issues such as the framing of human presence in the experience of art
