Medicalizing Ethnicity Vilma Santiago-Irizarry, 2001 In *Medicalizing Ethnicity* Vilma Santiago Irizarry shows how commendable intentions can produce unintended consequences Santiago Irizarry conducted ethnographic fieldwork in three bilingual bicultural psychiatric programs for Latino patients at public mental health facilities in New York City. The introduction of cultural sensitivity in mental health clinics she concludes led doctors to construct essentialized composite versions of Latino ethnicity in their drive to treat mental illness with sensitivity. The author demonstrates that stressing Latino differences when dealing with patients resulted not in empowerment as intended but in the reassertion of Anglo American standards of behavior in the guise of psychiatric categories by which Latino culture was negatively defined. For instance doctors routinely translated their patients beliefs in the Latino religious traditions of espiritismo and Santer a into psychiatric terms thus treating these beliefs as pathologies. Interpreting mental health care through the framework of culture and politics has potent effects on the understanding of normality toward which such care aspires. At the core of *Medicalizing Ethnicity* is the very definition of multiculturalism used by a variety of institutional settings in an attempt to mandate equality.
