

THE MET AU LOUVRE

Dialogues d'antiquités orientales

Le département des Antiquités orientales du musée du Louvre accueille à titre exceptionnel dix œuvres majeures du Metropolitan Museum of Art (The Met) de New York, le temps de la fermeture pour rénovation globale des salles du département d'Art du Proche-Orient ancien. Au sein de son parcours permanent, le Louvre a ainsi conçu avec le Met un dialogue inédit entre ces deux collections. Datées entre la fin du IV^e millénaire avant J.-C. et le VI^e siècle de notre ère, les œuvres venues exceptionnellement de New York introduisent de remarquables correspondances avec celles du Louvre, qu'elles forment ensemble une paire réunie pour la première fois à cette occasion ou bien qu'elles se complètent du fait des spécificités liées à l'histoire respective des deux collections. De l'Asie centrale à la Syrie en passant souvent par l'Iraq et la Mésopotamie, ces dialogues d'antiquités orientales permettront de découvrir autrement ces vestiges plurimillénaires et les histoires dont ils témoignent.



THE MET AT THE LOUVRE

Near Eastern Antiquities in Dialogue

The Musée du Louvre's Department of Near Eastern Antiquities is exceptionally hosting ten major artefacts from New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art (The Met), during the closure for renovation of its Department of Ancient Near Eastern Art. In its permanent galleries, the Louvre has created with The Met a unique dialogue between these two collections. Dating from between the end of the fourth millennium B.C. and the fifth century A.D., the Met's works, as exceptional guests, introduce remarkable correspondences with the Louvre's collections, either because they form a pair reunited for the first time on this occasion, or because they complement each other due to the specificities linked to the respective histories of the two collections. From Central Asia to Syria, often passing through Iraq and Mesopotamia, these dialogues between Near Eastern antiquities will allow to rediscover in a different way these remarkable multi-millennial artefacts and the histories to which they bear witness.
